Grad students researching teacher education

Attention graduate student supervisors:

Do you have a graduate student conducting research on a topic relevant to teacher education who will defend before the 2019 CSSE conference?? If so, please encourage that student to review the linked criteria and apply for the CATE Recognition Awards for Theses and Dissertations on Teacher Education. You will be required to submit a letter of recommendation as part of the student's application. The supervisors of successful applicants are also invited to briefly discuss the significance of the work and offer congratulations as part of the awards presentation if you are able to attend.

Attention graduate students:

If you expect to defend your thesis or dissertation between June 1, 2018-May 31, 2019, and you are completing research relevant to teacher education, please consider applying for the CATE Recognition Award for Theses and Dissertations on Teacher Education. While applicants are self-nominated, you must provide a letter of recommendation from your faculty supervisor as part of the application process.

Award Criteria:

For a thesis or dissertation to be considered for a recognition award, the study must directly address the field of teacher education not only in the conclusion, but throughout the research. The study must also connect to one or more of the following topics:

- (1) Teacher education and societal issues, (2) The study of teacher education practice, and (3) Challenges and possibilities for teacher education.

Successful applicants' work will be honoured with responses from the review panel at the CATE post-AGM celebration of teacher education in Canada. Applicants must indicate that they will be able to present their thesis/dissertation in poster type format at the CSSE conference (University of British Columbia, Vancouver, British Columbia, June 2-5, 2019). The faculty supervisors will also be invited to make a short presentation on the award winners and their studies. Successful applicants will receive a certificate of recognition and free membership to CATE in the subsequent year; however, all costs related to travel and conference registration are to be covered by the candidates.

To have a thesis or dissertation considered for an award please review the linked criteria and submission form. Submissions are due March 1, 2019. Completed submissions should be sent electronically as Word or PDF attachments, including the letter of recommendation from your faculty supervisor, to:

Dr. Jan Hare's CATE Keynote Presentation: Trickster Comes to Teacher Education

The trickster or shape shifter is an important cultural being within Indigenous learning traditions. This figure uses strategies of creation, humour, dialogic pedagogy, and experience to upset dominant paradigms of our world, including education. Through the metaphor of the trickster, who acts with critical purpose, this presentation (re)imagines the much needed transformation of teacher education to empower Indigenous teacher candidates in advancing their own journeys of decolonization and reclamation and consider programmatic opportunities that can enrich and be enriched by Indigenous communities.

Dr. Jan Hare is an Anishinaabe scholar and educator from the M'Chigeeng First Nation in northern Ontario. She is the Associate Dean for Indigenous Education and Director of NITEP – Indigenous Teacher Education Program in the Faculty of Education at the University of British Columbia. She has led the development of required Indigenous education course instruction in teacher education at UBC, as well as establishing new pathways to teacher education for Indigenous students through NITEP. Her research and teaching is concerned with centering Indigenous knowledge systems from early childhood, K to 12 education, and post-secondary settings. She has developed the Massive Open Online Course, Reconciliation Through Indigenous Education, which has seen over 35,000 participants from around the world in its course offerings.

À travers la métaphore du filou qui agit avec un but critique, cette présentation imagine la transformation indispensable de la formation des enseignants afin de permettre aux candidats enseignants autochtones de progresser dans leur propre parcours de décolonisation et de remise en état et d'envisager des opportunités de programmation qui peuvent enrichir et s'enrichir. par les communautés autochtones.

Jan Hare est une universitaire et éducatrice anishinaabe de la Première nation M'Chigeeng dans le nord de l'Ontario. Elle est vice-doyenne de l'éducation autochtone et directrice du programme NITEP - Programme de formation des enseignants autochtones à la faculté d'éducation de l'Université de la Colombie-Britannique. Elle a dirigé le développement de l'enseignement obligatoire des cours d'éducation autochtone dans la formation des enseignants à l'Université de la Colombie-Britannique, ainsi que la création de nouvelles voies de formation pour les étudiants autochtones par le biais du NITEP. Ses recherches et son enseignement portent sur le recentrage des systèmes de connaissances autochtones depuis la petite enfance, la maternelle à la 12e année et les établissements postsecondaires. Elle a mis au point le cours en ligne ouvert et massif, Réconciliation par l'éducation autochtone, qui a accueilli plus de 35 000 participants du monde entier.



Also, there are details about the 2019 Tidal WAV event at Creekside Park in Vancouver, in cooperation with the Junior Ranger program from the Vancouver Parks Board and Science World.
